## Safety is everyone's responsibility!

When each person in the lab does their part, the lab is a safer place to work.

- Avoid working alone in the lab. Notify others if solitary work cannot be avoided and have someone periodically check in.
- Review standard operating procedures and follow them carefully.
- Review chemical <u>Safety Data Sheets (SDS)</u> and be knowledgeable about the hazards of the chemical being handled and waste disposal.
- Frequently check hazardous waste accumulation storage areas and arrange for <u>disposal</u> as needed. Avoid accumulating large amounts of hazardous waste.
- A clean lab is a safe lab! Keep areas tidy and organized.
- Include safety topics in your lab, school, and departmental meetings.
- Review and share EH&S <u>onboarding resources</u> with new faculty and staff.
- <u>Email EH&S staff</u> for support in safely achieving research goals.
